SOUTH CAROLINA SAFE ELECTIONS

SC Safe Elections is a grassroots group of concerned citizens all over the state of South Carolina who want to return confidence to the election process. Our mission is to make sure our elections are transparent, simple, and secure.

Our goals are:

- enhanced auditability, accuracy, and accountability;
- one-day voting with hand-counted, hand-marked paper ballots;
- timely and accurate maintenance of voter rolls; and
- decentralization of the election process.

We are suing the SC State Election Commission for its refusal to release standard audit reports which help citizens verify the details of how their votes were counted; a necessary oversight of election results. Our lawsuit is supported by:

- affidavits from citizens who were denied Cast Vote Records (CVRs) from SC counties;
- expert witness testimonies of election irregularities; and
- suspicious findings from CVR reports obtained nationwide.

The lawsuit is complex, expensive, and may affect election integrity efforts on a national level. We are asking YOU to support our efforts to secure safe and transparent elections in SC. This is a non-partisan issue. Any fraudulent vote could cancel out your own.

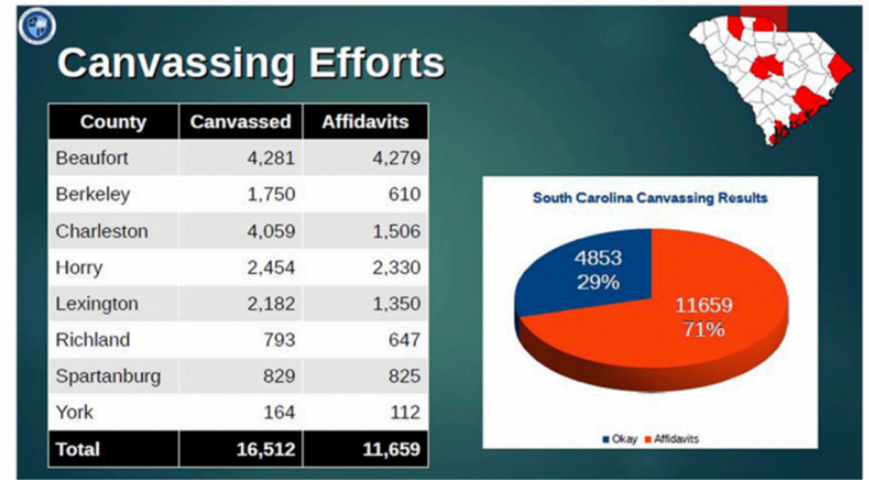
Selections Have Consequences

LACK OF TRANSPARENCY IN ELECTION RESULTS IS A MAJOR ISSUE IN SOUTH CAROLINA.

“All elections by the people shall be by secret ballot, but the ballots shall not be counted in secret.”

South Carolina Constitution

Results are counted in secret by voting system software without citizen oversight. These practices by the SC State Election Commission (SEC) are in violation of the SC Constitution.



2020 Election: We canvassed sections of eight counties and discovered voters who were deceased, moved away, and registered to commercial properties. These suspicious findings were delivered to the SC State Law Enforcement Division (SLED) - without response.

2022 Primary: Our poll observation activities revealed missing and voided tamper-resistant security seals, machine “glitches”, inadequate chain-of-custody documentation, and candidates missing from ballots as well as other indicators of maladministration.
